

Report on Students Feed Back

A Statistical Tool '**Mode**' is used to analyze the feedback obtained from students regarding all teachers through pre-structured questionnaire.

Analysis has been done on the following basis:

- 1) A purposive random sample of 20 students has been taken for each regular and contributory teacher.
- 2) In all 20 questions were given to the students.
- 3) In the given format the feedback regarding not agree option has been considered.
- 4) A table is prepared for noting the observations.
- 5) A table is prepared to calculate Mode.
- 6) The most repeated frequency is considered as mode.
- 7) Each teacher is strong in 18 areas of teaching learning process except two comparatively weaker areas. Each teacher has been told orally about improvement in weaker (two) areas.
