- Change the terms of ('vary') the judgment.
- Pay it back in instalments.

## Warning

### Note to the defendant

If you did reply to the claim form and believe judgment has been entered wrongly in default, you may apply to the court office giving your reasons why the judgment should be set aside. An application form is available for you to use and you will need to pay a fee. A hearing may be arranged and you will be told when and where it will take place. If you live in or carry on business in another court's area, the claim may be transferred to that court

Details of this judgment will be entered in a public register, the Register of Judgments, Orders and Fines. They will be passed to credit reference agencies, which will supply them to credit grantors and others seeking information on your financial standing. This will make it difficult for you to get credit. A list of all credit reference agencies is available from Registry Trust Ltd, 3rd Floor, 12 Carthusian Street, London, EC1M 6EB. If you pay in full within one month, you can ask the court to cancel the entry on the Register. You will also need to give the court proof of payment. There is no fee to do this. If you also want a Certificate of Cancellation from the court, a fee is payable. If you pay the debt in full after one month, you can ask the court to mark the entry on the Register as satisfied and, for a fee, obtain a Certificate of Satisfaction to prove the debt has been paid.

If Judgment is for £5000 or more or is in respect of a debt that attracts contractual or statutory interest for late payment, the claimant may be entitled to further interest.

### How to Pay

- Payment(s) must be made to the person named at the address for payment, giving the claimant's reference and claim number.
- **DO NOT** bring or send payments to the court. They will not be accepted.
- Please **DO NOT** send cash through the post.
- You should allow at least 4 days for your payment to reach the claimant or their representative.
- Make sure you keep records and can account for all payments made. Proof may be required if there is any disagreement. It is not safe to send cash unless you use registered post
