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

ABOVE: Porcelain tile imported from Italy extends along the length of the "runway"—a cantilevered extension of the patio that rises above the ravine 30 feet below. Mature rhododendrons were planted along the side of the overlook and 3-sided infinity-edge pool to meld with the home's over 100-year-old landscape.

FACING PAGE TOP: A rectilinear fountain draws the eye toward the home's front façade, where the original Tudor-style half-timbering takes center stage. Inside, everything from the lights and security system to the audio/visual devices can be controlled through fully integrated smart home technology.


FACING PAGE BOTTOM: A beautiful lagoon, private golf course, and a rose garden are among the home's incredible natural features on the 4.5-acre site. When a 100-year-old beehive was discovered onsite, a professional apiculturist was hired to transport the hive to a new location over two days. A self-sufficient irrigation system that filters water throughout the property was installed to allow for irrigation during water restrictive months.

ABOVE: The grand foyer of The Gables provides a transition between the heritage and modern sides of the home. The team restored the original woodwork and hardwood floors to their original splendor. Current décor elements help to reinforce the blended feel between the two styles.

RIGHT: Views from the gabled loft are the best in the house, extending to the local Fraser River, Vancouver Airport, and Vancouver Island. Joe's intimate knowledge of home building allowed him to see the opportunity to add a gabled loft to a previously unusable attic space. Accessible via its own stairway, the loft is more than 1,000 square feet and includes a kitchen, bathroom, and living area.

FACING PAGE TOP: The heritage living room was completely restored to bring life back to the cornice, crown, and plaster moulding. Radiant heat warms the original hardwood floors; the team installed the heating elements from the basement below to preserve the original floor. As part of the renovation, the heritage section of the home gained a reinforced structure, updated insulation, electrical and plumbing systems, as well as all of the modern technologies and amenities.

FACING PAGE BOTTOM: The new kitchen features radiant heated floors, energy-efficient appliances, and ample room for family meals. A glass stairway seems to float through the space.

BELOW: Retractable glass doors in the modern living room open the indoors to the outdoor living spaces. Built level with one another, the living space flows to the patio seamlessly through perfectly symmetric material transition and creates a sense that the living room is merely an extension of the outdoor living space. Many of the heritage windows, as well as some of the doors, from the original home were repurposed for the gardening shed nearby, which feels like an extension of the home through a beautiful blended design.


FACING PAGE TOP: The living room flows to the intimate dining area and the adjacent kitchen, creating an open feel that is at once contemporary and extremely comfortable. Gentle sunlight kisses the Italian porcelain tile outside and the radiant heated flooring inside.


FACING PAGE BOTTOM: A nine-foot custom firepit is just one of the many outstanding outdoor features of The Gables. Lights along the runway and in the pool provide romantic ambient light. Each outdoor space received the same amount of attention to detail and meticulous craftsmanship as the interior. Marino General Contracting has received the CHBA National Award for Whole House Renovation Over \$1 Million, provincial Georgie Award for Best Outdoor Living Space, and multiple local Vancouver awards for Best Heritage Home Renovation, Best Kitchen and Greatroom Renovation, and Best Whole Home Renovation over \$3 Million.






RIGHT: The Kitsilano Dreaming residence was in shambles when Joe Marino and the homeowner originally viewed it, but with an unparalleled ability to see the potential in forgotten homes, Joe convinced the client that the house was a diamond in the rough. The new dining room features beautiful hardwood floors and a subtle tray ceiling detail.

Retractable glass doors provide ample sunlight and mirror the retractable glass doors at the opposite end of the open concept main floor.
