Fixtures every weekend with a break at Christmas and Easter (we don't break for half term)

The season ends 24th/25th May 2025



#### **YOUR ROLE**



What it **should be**:

Set an example and encourage children to develop their skills, grow friendships and love the game.

What it shouldn't be:

Winning games at all costs, marginalising 'weaker' children, berating children and referees for poor performance.

It should never be about you!

### HOW DOES THE LEAGUE HELP PLAYER DEVELOPMENT?



- We do:
  - o mandate every child has **AT LEAST** 50% game time
  - move teams between divisions to ensure you're being challenged at the right level (reviewed approximately every 6 weeks)
  - celebrate the development of children and their love for the game
  - fully endorse the FA Respect principles
- We don't:
  - o publish scores, results or league tables
    - we will charge clubs if we see anyone publishing results on social media
  - o promote or demote teams
  - award teams or managers for winning

# Safeguarding AND QUALIFICATIONS

### TO BE PITCHSIDE THE LEAGUE REQUIRES THAT YOU MUST HAVE:



#### **FA DBS**

The DBS must be indate and must have been provided by the FA – records are stored online – check yours at myaccount.thefa.com



#### **SAFEGUARDING CHILDREN**

There are various FA provided Safeguarding Courses, but

Safeguarding Children is Mandatory



#### **FA FIRST AID COURSE**

One person must hold a valid **FA First Aid Course** 

#### Some notes and exceptions...

- Parent referees do not need a DBS or Safeguarding Children (\*they will do if they referee more than 3 games in a month)
- Players do not need any qualifications
- Parents must never enter the pitch or surrounding areas for any reason they must remain outside the barriers
- Your Clubs are all England Accredited. To achieve that, one Manager or Coach must also hold the Introduction to Coaching Football qualification (or old Level 1). The league does not check for this, but if your team does not have someone with this, your Club are in breach of the England Accreditation which breaches League Rules.



#### **FIXTURES**

- All fixtures will be release in w/c 26<sup>th</sup> August
- Fixture cover until at least Christmas plan ahead with your parent groups.
- Your fixtures will be available via the FA Matchday App
  - Ask Club Secretary if you can't get access
- Any changes to fixtures that the league make we will try to do 2 weeks in advance.
  - Note we do not always notify of changes check Matchday App!
- Cancellations
  - o If you cannot fulfil a fixture you must give 2 weeks notice
  - School Events, Cub & Beaver Events, Remembrance Sunday are the only valid reasons for cancellation
  - Lack of players is rarely acceptable you can play with 5 players.
  - Non-fulfilment risks a league charge



#### WEATHER



- Simple rule your match is on until we tell you otherwise
- It is very rare for matches on 3G to be cancelled, but more frequent on grass.
- Only the referee or venue can cancel a match the league may intervene if appropriate.
  - We will communicate via WhatsApp, Facebook and the Website
- Pitch inspections will take place between 08:00 and 08:30 the day of matches if there are to be cancellations they will be notified then.
- Football is an outdoor game; wet or cold weather is not a reason for cancellation
- We ONLY use the MetOffice for our forecasts
- In the event of obvious, significant adverse weather we may cancel matches early
- We will never play if Thunder/Lightning occurs (Leave the pitch immediately if it happens mid-match)

#### **BEFORE THE MATCH**

STIEIGH & DISTRICT

- Check the FA Matchday App for fixture details and times
  - You should also get a weekly email from the FA Fulltime system with opponent contact details (Check with Club Secretary if you don't!)
  - You can also check for contact details on the EDMSL website
- Make contact with your opponent make sure you know what colour kit they're
  playing in
  - You need an alternative colour kit EDMSL allows wearing of numbered bibs
- Arrange to meet 10-15 minutes before your kick off time
- Make sure you have a first aid kit with you and bibs for your substitutes.
- Pack a Ball Size 3 for all ages (Home team provides the match ball).
- Make sure you have your squad list

#### **SQUAD LISTS**

- Your squad list shows all registered and available players
- It also shows the managers and coaches who are allowed to be pitchside
- Anyone not on your squad list should not be on the pitch or pitchside
  - You will be charged if we find anyone pitchside who isn't on your squad list
  - Anyone not on your squad list will be asked to leave the pitch even if that means the game has to stop
- Before the match you must show your squad list to your opponent and to the referee
- You must also show your squad list to any league representative that asks to see it.
- You will be charged if you do not have your squad list on you



#### **SQUAD LISTS**

- A valid squad list can be downloaded from clubs.thefa.com (or from your Club Secretary)
- All coaches must have a picture
- The FA Matchday App IS NOT a valid squad list
  - It doesn't show coaches and doesn't show player pictures.
- A screenshot on a phone IS acceptable (but we prefer paper copies)
- Download new copies when changes to your team occur e.g. new players, coaches added/removed
  - It is yours and your club's responsibility to ensure squad lists are accurate



#### **PLAYING KITS**



- Must be common style and colour and must be numbered
- **Kits cannot be black** (that's reserved for referees)
- Kits cannot have names or initials on
- You need an away kit but EDMSL allow use of numbered bibs
- The GK needs a different shirt

#### REFEREES

- EDMSL will try and provide a qualified referee for your fixtures –there are not enough to cover every match
- Appointed Referees are provided by Hants FA, not by EDMSL
- Referees are usually assigned no later than Friday afternoon but can be assigned on Matchday
- If you don't have a Ref assigned (or if Ref is unwell), then the Home team needs to provide one
  - This can be a coach or parent... But it CANNOT BE
     THE MANAGER
  - Ask a couple of parents to be prepared to ref

- The majority of appointed referees are children think very carefully about how you interact with them
  - The League, Hants FA and the FA do not tolerate any form of abuse to the referees – regardless of age – from anyone
  - Make sure your parents are briefed
- Any person who referees a game of Development Football has the authority to apply the Laws of Mini-Soccer even if they are not a fully qualified referee.

THE REFEREE IS RIGHT. ALWAYS.

(\*EVEN WHEN THEY'RE NOT)



#### AT THE MATCH



- Warm up away from the Playing areas and don't interfere with in-flight matches
- Show your squad list to your opponent & referee
- Please check for any safeguarding issues with your opponent and advise parents accordingly
- Setup your technical area
  - Make it big enough to accommodate all your kit and subs
  - Subs must remain in the technical area (wearing bibs)
- Make sure you have a Respect Marshall identified who understands the role.
   (Hi-vis jackets to be worn)
- Early morning kick-offs and transition kick-offs might be asked to help move the goals into position depending on venue

#### AT THE MATCH


STEIGH & DISTRICT

- Applaud both teams
- Mandatory every player plays at least 50% of the match (more is better!)
- Avoid constantly talking and directing you don't need to worry about not being involved in the game – LET THEM PLAY
  - The FA Their Game rules apply to all EDMSL matches
- Keep your language polite you're an example to the players.
- DO NOT abuse the referee or opposition
- Stay in your Technical area do not prowl the line
- Prior to kick-off, players should shake hands (Respect Handshake)

# HEADING IN YOUTH FOOTBALL DELIBERATE HEADER RESTART LAW



#### **RULES**

STIEIGH & DISTRICT

- We DO NOT play extra time your match starts and ends as scheduled.
- All free kicks are Direct (except for Deliberate Heading which is Indirect)
- A goal cannot be scored directly from a kick off
- Kick off can be taken in any direction (opposition to be 5 yards away)
- Shin pads must be worn no shin pads, no play. Mini Shin Pads are strongly discouraged
- Sin Bins are in use and Yellow/Red cards can be issued.
- All jewellery must be removed the FA no longer allow taping of earrings.
- Children are learning the game EDMSL asks all referees (including parent/coaches) to educate, allow them to try again before penalising.
  - As the children get older, the tolerance reduces



#### **VENUES**

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- Venue Maps will be available on the EDMSL website (edmsl.org.uk)
- Venue Emergency Action Plans are also available on the EDMSL website
- Venue Maps show warm up areas
- Time between matches is short please finish and leave do team talks away from the pitch
- Stoneham Lane Football Complex requires a QR code to gain entrance
  - EVERYONE visiting needs their own code
  - Please ask parents to register before the first day you cannot register in person on site – it's all online.
- Stoneham also has strict footwear rules (please check the website)
- You can/should use the overflow parking at Stoneham please only park in marked bays

#### **AFTER THE MATCH**



- Congratulate the opposition encourage players to shake hands
- Collect your belongings and exit the pitch promptly the next match could be kicking off in as little as 5 minutes after you finish.
- Deliver any post-match team talks away from the pitch
  - We would encourage you to deliver these in front of parents
- Submit your Scores and Respect Marks via the FA Matchday App
  - Must be submitted by 7pm night of your match
- If you have an appointed ref and you want to provide more feedback than Matchday allows, use the Google Form.

# DISCIPLINE

#### **DISCIPLINE RULES**

STEEGH & DISTRICT

- Each team has a 5-point threshold and each proven charge incurs a number of points.
- If you breach the 5 point threshold:
  - o 1st Step The Club Secretary and Team Manager are to meet with the league
  - o 2<sup>nd</sup> Step The Club are asked to put an improvement plan in place
  - o 3<sup>rd</sup> Step Loss of fixtures for 1 month
  - o 4th Step Removal from the League

# RESPECT

#### **FA RESPECT PROGRAMME**

- Set a positive example for those you're responsible for and show respect to everyone involved in the game.
- Encourage fair play
- Respect the referee
- Never enter the field of play without the Referee's permission
- Be gracious in victory and defeat
- After a match you are asked to mark your opposition for:
  - Behaviours on the pitch (players and coaches)
  - Behaviours around the pitch (parents and supporters)
- As a league we reward teams with 100% marks
- Those with low marks can be excluded from the cups







#### **FA RESPECT PROGRAMME**

STIEGH & OSSIRICI

- Marking your opposition in the Matchday App:
  - You give a Traffic Light Score Red = regular issues, Amber = some issues, Green = all good
  - You must provide a comment if you do not award a Green
  - The EDMSL Discipline team may ask for more information about your report please provide it so they can take appropriate action.
  - Note: on field issues should be raised via your Club Secretary to Hants FA not the league
- Things that are not cause for marking Amber or Red:
  - Hard or firm tackles if they are genuine attempts to win the ball.
  - Shoulder barges, fouls or late tackles
  - Asking the referee questions at an appropriate time in an appropriate tone
  - Constantly talking and coaching
  - Referee performance


#### **SHARING INFORMATION**

- Your AGC is your point of contact. Managers & Coaches are NOT to contact the league secretary that will result in a club charge.
- There is a WhatsApp group for each Age Group where the AGC will post updates and reminders – AGCs do not send or reply to emails
- Please DO NOT message the AGC directly (unless of an issue on Matchday)
- To ask your AGC a question, there is a **Google Form linked in the Age Group** description in WhatsApp. The form is for:
  - Requesting fixture time change
  - Requesting a cancellation
  - Requesting to be added to the WhatsApp group
- The form is not for reporting respect or safeguarding issues.
- Any other questions should be directed to your Club Secretary they can contact the league for clarification if required.

- Managers Page, Venue Maps, News and Cup details (when the time comes) will all be shared here.
- Additionally you can find the contact details for all managers and the kit colours for all teams.
