Pocono Race Traffic Detours

With the upcoming Pocono Races approaching on Saturday June 21st & Sunday, June 22nd, 2025, the Pennsylvania State Police, Troop N, would like to provide some important traffic patterns involving construction projects for people traveling in the area of the race track:

- **Flaggers will be at the 115 project in Effort to allow SB traffic from the race to continue through the project on Sunday from 4:00 PM -10:00 PM.**
- **Flaggers will be at the 115 project in Effort to allow SB traffic from the race to continue through the project on Monday from 7:00 AM-12:00 PM.**
- **For the overnight hours and beyond 12:00PM Monday, Chestnuthill Twp is allowing motorists to use White Church Road as an easier route to 715 South, thus avoiding the sharp turn at Sugar Hollow and 715. This will be signed for RV Traffic to follow.**
- **A message board on 115 near Sugar Hollow Road that will state “115 open to through traffic”.**

If the race would be delayed, these measures will be in place on Monday evening and Tuesday morning as required.

This weekend will be a large group of motorists to the area. We urge people to be aware of the added traffic, and plan ahead to avoid delays.

Any information obtained from outside sources which was not released by the Pennsylvania State Police, Troop N, should be considered ‘unofficial’.

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In the interest of transparency, it is the policy of PSP to disseminate information regarding incidents which are likely to generate significant interest among the public and media in a timely manner.
