<b>Strong liquor (over 25% proof)</b>	Must be declared on separate inventory.	Duty free up to 12 litres.	For additional quantity very heavy duty and taxes are applied (over SFr.50. - per bottle).
<b>Firearms</b>	Exact description on inventory make, model, calibre etc.	Some require import permit to be obtained from Federal Authorities in Bern, others not, depending on the exact type.	To be loaded to allow easy access for customs inspection.

Wooden packing material imported from outside of Europe and from Portugal will be subject to heated treatment proofed with an according ISPM Seal.</p>	<p>The wooden packing material must be marked in a visible location on each article, if possible on two opposite sides of the package.
